#4. Empty threats are...well...empty.

Kids love empty threats. They know how to "work the system." I always try to follow through on discipline if the guidelines were clearly stated beforehand.

#3. Parental Communication:

Parents should learn to discuss, communicate, and agree on how they are going to love, encourage, and discipline their children <u>before</u> the children come along.

#2. Yelling, Shouting, Raising My Voice:

I struggle with these. I've found that these are not the best ways to communicate with my kids. I've also found that I handle things much better when I am prepared for difficult situations that might arise.

#1. Prayer:

It just works. I don't think there is any other way to show our love for our children than to pray for them. Philippians 1:9-11. "And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best, to be pure and blameless until the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ—to the glory and praise of God."

Discipline & Love:

The Top 10 Things I've Learned About Raising Kids Hebrews 12:5b..the Lord disciplines those He loves.

#10. It seemed much easier when our kids were younger:

It's nap time. Bed-time's at 8:00. And "no" because I said so worked really well. Now with three teenagers, it's more difficult.

#9. Pick Your Battles:

When our kids were younger, people would tell me that when they get older, Annette and I would have to learn to "pick our battles." I also remember thinking that it was dumb. I was wrong.

#8. Creative Discipline:

If we discipline out of love, which God does for us, then I have learned that I really need to understand my child. One type of discipline with one child doesn't always work with another.

#7. Not all creative discipline works:

Once, just a few days before leaving on vacation, the kids were really misbehaving and fighting, and this had been going on for a while. It was stressing us and particularly Annette. So we decided to tell the kids that Annette would not be joining us on the vacation because the kids were so unpleasant to be around. Well, this brought out the desired response. A short while later, four letters were handed to Annette containing all kinds of remorseful and repentant words. However, not more than two hours later, the kids had already started bickering over who would get mom's seat in the front of the car on vacation.

#6. Creative Encouragement

It can be fun and provide great results to learn different ways to encourage and motivate your children. Just this year as Taylor was getting ready to play a varsity softball game, instead of telling her "this is a big game" or "you really need to do well tonight," I told her that she always does well against this particular team and that she is a good team leader. Since then, her confidence has soared and the results have been very positive.

#5. Leverage Rocks!

As mentioned earlier, it gets more difficult to discipline our kids as they get older. But, things like IPods, cell phones, and driving privileges are great tools to use as leverage to discipline when necessary.
