WE'RE ALL INFECTED

While singing at a hospital recently, Annette and I noticed one of the patients wearing a hat with the words, "We're ALL infected."

Those words had been on my mind for a while as I pondered their meaning. In chapter 5 of Luke we read where the Pharisees and their scribes were upset...

²⁹ Then Levi held a great banquet for Jesus at his house, and a large crowd of tax collectors and others were eating with them. ³⁰ But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law who belonged to their sect complained to his disciples, "Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?" ³¹ Jesus answered them, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. ³² I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance."

We are all infected. A better way to put it would be that we are all sinners. Rom 3:23 reads, "For <u>all</u> have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." The Pharisees own selfrighteousness and confidence in themselves led them to falsely believe that they were "healthy" and above others and in no need of being saved from their sins. What a dangerous place to be.

Jesus wasn't saying that the Pharisees were healthy by any means, but that their own pride kept them from seeing their need of a Savior. They, just like "the sick" (those who know they are sinners) needed to repent of their sins, but the Pharisees refused to open their eyes and hearts to see that we <u>all</u> need Jesus because "we are all infected." --scott
