Killing Sin

Recently I have been reading a book called *The Mortification of Sin* written in 1656 by John Owen. I'm not sure how I'd heard about the book, but it has certainly left a powerful impact on me. The book has forced me to ask some probing questions of myself and my life as a follower of Christ: Am I daily recognizing and confessing sin, or do I just trivialize it? Am I striving more and more each day to grow in Christ or am I just on cruise control? Am I asking the Lord as David did to "search me and know my heart...to see if there be any hurtful way in me," (Psalm 139)...or David again in Psalm 51, praying to God "to create in me a clean heart...for You desire truth in the innermost being"?

Although I am certainly aware that I'm to blame for my own lackadaisical approach in this area, I can't help but think that here in the United States we are also victims of weak preaching. It seems rare to hear of a sermon from a pastor in this country calling out his congregation to be in the habit of daily mortifying sin. In his book, Owen writes, "Believers in Christ, though completely free from the condemning power of sin, still ought to make it their business every day of their lives to be killing the indwelling power of sin that still remains in them." He goes on, "There is not a day in our lives in which sin does not either defeat us or is defeated, prevails over us or is prevailed over, and it will be like this as long as we live in this world...believers whose souls long to be delivered from the troubling and persistent power of indwelling sin know there is no safety against it except through constant warfare."

But really the question that we should be asking ourselves as Christians isn't "how did we get here?" but instead "what am I doing now to please the Lord in this area of my life?"

The Apostle Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 13:5, "Test yourselves to see if you are in the faith; examine yourselves! Or do you not recognize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you-unless indeed you fail the test?" We should be asking ourselves: Is sin decreasing in my life? When I stumble in an area of sin am I mortified by it? Do I hate it? Paul also wrote to the Philippians in Philippians 2:12 and told them to "work out your salvation with fear and trembling."

We as believers are responsible to be continually obedient to the Lord in the process to become more like Christ. As true believers in Jesus, let's "fight the good fight." Let's love God's Word, and study and meditate on it and hide it in our hearts to help keep us from sin. (Psalm 119:11) May we as children of God, and until Christ's return, always be at the task of mortifying sin. --scott
