Where to Begin

Recently one of our FCA leaders overheard a conversation from two of our students who were discussing faith and belief in God and struggling to understand how to become a true believer and follower of Christ. In particular, the students were asking how to begin their life with Jesus. Where do they start? I was encouraged that they were discussing these things. As I was preparing for the following FCA meeting, I was praying and asking for God's leading. Then, I remembered again when I believed and trusted in Christ as my Lord and Savior. It was way back in 1982, and the one thing that I remember clearly after hearing the Gospel was that of my own sinfulness. I remember acknowledging my awful wretchedness and the need to be saved from my sins. In Romans 3:23, Paul writes that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." And in Romans 3:10, "there is none righteous, not even one." People struggle with confessing sin. Many of our students have been told all of their lives that they are "good kids" and also they have been led to believe that through some kind of ceremony or church service (something they did) that they were saved. So the thought of sin or being a sinner is far from them. But the message of the Bible is that we are all sinners and that God did for us what we can't do. He paid for our sins by giving his only son to die on the cross (something we deserved) as our substitute. Romans 6:23 says, "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." We are all sinners. We are completely lost and incapable of saving ourselves. The reality of our sinfulness and our inability to do anything about it is where we must start. I'm reminded of the words of Jesus in Luke 18. He told the parable to some of those who "trusted in themselves that they were righteous... But the tax collector, standing some distance away, was even unwilling to lift up his eyes to heaven, but was beating his breast saying, God, be merciful to me, the sinner!" Jesus went on to say that this man was justified for his humility. This man had an honest view of himself, his sinfulness, and his complete helplessness to do anything about it but cry out to God for mercy. The tax collector shows us where we must begin. --scott
